



## EU Member States asked to voluntarily monitor some brominated flame retardants in food

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On 29 November, an EU expert group<sup>[1]</sup> supported a European Commission Recommendation<sup>[2]</sup> to encourage EU Member States to monitor the presence of some brominated flame retardants<sup>[3]</sup> in food and feed over a two-year period.

The Recommendation aims to update the European Food Safety Authority's (EFSA) 6 Scientific Opinions on the presence of brominated flame retardants in food and feed<sup>[4]</sup> which were delivered in 2012. EFSA found that current dietary exposure in the European Union does not raise a health concern.

The Recommendation is voluntary and Member States can decide which of the listed brominated flame retardants to monitor and in which food categories.

BSEF companies support initiatives which further scientific understanding on brominated flame retardants, in this case so as to ensure that they do not adversely impact the safety of food nor feed. BSEF welcomes the proposed programme to generate new data. BSEF members also operate VECAP<sup>[5]</sup>, a voluntary initiative to reduce potential emissions of flame retardants through responsible management.
